
We are getting to that time of year when transition begins to cross people's minds - whether it be to another school, Key Stage or class. I can confirm that the next academic year we have an almost full EYFS starting at Vallis and as such the structure of the school will change slightly due to the lower numbers in our current EYFS. For the 2022 - 23 academic year, we will have two EYFS classes; three mixed Year 1 and Year 2 classes; two Year 3 classes and two Year 4 classes. We are in the process of deciding on staffing for September and allocating children to classes, and we will of course keep you updated. This year, Frome schools will be having a transition day on Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> July when our Year 4s will have an opportunity to visit their Middle Schools - more information on this will come directly from them. At Vallis, we will also use the morning on this day for children to spend some time with their new classes and teachers.

On the last day of this term - Friday 27<sup>th</sup> May the VSA have very kindly organised a Jubilee party for all the children which, weather permitting, will be held on the front playground. As part of this, we will be having a picnic lunch and so all hot dinner children will be provided with sandwiches etc. on this day - parents are also invited so please bring a picnic lunch and blanket to sit on. Children can come to school on this day in red, white and blue.

Another date for your diary is Monday 13th June when we are hoping to hold our Sports Day where all parents will be invited for the first time since 2019. As in pre-COVID years, we hope to hold the sports events on the school field and then invite parents/carers back to school for a picnic lunch with the children. More details with timings will follow.

On June 10th 2022 Ali Sturgess will be running the Bath Half Marathon for the second time after saying she would never do it again! She was supposed to be running this last year and the date has now been changed 3 times so she and her friend Nicky Halford have decided to run our half marathon virtually rather than waiting for October, the latest date they have been given. The reason she has decided to run again is because of the amazing local charity she will be raising money for 'Time Is Precious'. Time is Precious is a voluntary run charity which has been running since 2011. It was set up by Neil and Nicky Halford in memory of their son Ben who sadly died from cancer, he was age 5. The aim of the charity is to help create a more comfortable and relaxed atmosphere for children and their families in hospital or at home, by working alongside specialists to purchase equipment and refurbish areas to make a difference to children with an illness or disability. #### **Swimming Survey Results**

Thank you so much to everyone who completed our swimming survey – over 50% of our parent body contributed their views and we really appreciate you taking the time to tell us what you think. The survey has now closed.

In terms of swimming going forward, 55% of those who completed the survey felt that it should not be an optional lesson as swimming with peers and extra practice for those who have lessons outside of school were beneficial. There was both positive and negative feedback from parents/carers with children in KS2 who have had the chance to take part in lessons, mainly about the about the quality of teaching and temperature of the pool - we will speak to the team at Frome Leisure Centre and work with them to try to improve the provision where possible. 80% were happy with the cost of the lessons/transport. Some respondents asked specific questions about what happens at swimming (time to dry hair/changing arrangements etc), and we will include the answers to these questions in the letter that goes out advising you of the date lessons will start for your child (usually sent the term before their lessons start in KS2).

It was clear from the survey that the majority would like swimming lessons to continue to be offered at Vallis. Part of the reason we issued the survey was due to a large number of families not paying the contribution for the lessons, which means that the school has to cover the deficit with money set aside for other curriculum activities. We wanted to make sure swimming was something that you still wanted us to offer.

If your child has had swimming lessons this year and you have not yet paid in full, or a small contribution, please drop it in to the office when you can. Children in Milky Way Class can continue to pay for lessons weekly as they are still going each week.

Thanks again for your feedback – from now on we will be using surveys to get your views on specific school related matters on an as and when basis and we were really pleased with the response to this first attempt!
