## **School Opening Times consultation**

You may have heard in the press last year that the Government is looking at extending the school day so that children spend 32 hours in school per week. This would mean we would potentially need to extend our current day by an additional 25 minutes. The Government is still reviewing this proposal as part of a wider bill that will go to Parliament in the future, but we want to be able to have a plan in place in case the timescales between any bill being approved and when we have to implement changes to our school day being short. We have therefore put together this quick survey asking for your preferences on how we could change the school day to accommodate the extra 25 minutes. We want to stress that this is purely to help us plan in case we have to make any changes – it is not a definite change to our day and if we need to make changes with line with any new legislation we will give you as much notice as possible.
