

PE AND SPORTS GRANT 2017-2018

Sport Grant is an amount of money which the government has agreed to allocate to schools to increase the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision, and increase participation in PE and Sport. The funding amount received by schools is based upon the number of children of primary age at the school.

At Vallis First School the PE Lead Teacher, Miss R Stock, has the responsibility for developing PE and Sport and contributing towards the effective use of Sport Grant funding. Our school, as part of our Local Learning Partnership, already has a good reputation for Sport and P.E. and we are proud of all of our sporting achievements. We welcome the additional funding, which will further enhance our provision and provide additional opportunities for increased participation.

The following table shows how Vallis First School intends to spend the 2017/2018 Sports Grant (£9,155) and the 2016/2017 carry forward (£7,315).

Impact Statement 2017 (based on use of 2016-2017 Sport Grant Funding)

- Pupil participation in sporting activity remains high as a result of our membership of Frome School Sports Partnership. We participated in sporting competitions and festivals held at local schools. This membership also provided access to high quality facilities, equipment and professional expertise.
- The school participated in Indian Dance days and an Olympic Dance experience.
- Evidence of higher levels of interest in sports is demonstrated via after schools clubs registers.
- We used some funding to commission a visual audit of our playground with a view to making it more accessible all year round and zoned to enable areas of climbing/building/active/quiet and nature-led play.
- We retained a high carry forward in anticipation of adding it to 2017/18 funding to enable the all-weather turf to be installed which was as a result of the above audit.
