Tallest

Who can make the tallest tower? Rules

- *You must decide and agree which objects to use (stones, pebbles, Lego, playing cards, boxes, coins etc.)
- *You must all use the same materials
- *Take turns to build your towers
- *Make a chart to record your findings
- *Use a tape measure or ruler to measure your towers

- *Which tower is the tallest?
- *Which tower is the shortest?
- *What is the difference between the tallest and the shortest tower?
- *Can you repeat this activity with different objects?

Fastest

Who has the fastest fingers? Who can put on the most pairs of socks in 30 seconds?

You will need lots of socks and a stopwatch Rules

*Use a stopwatch to time each other putting on socks

- *Who put on the most pairs of pairs of socks?
- *Who put on the least pairs of socks?
- *What is the difference between the most and the least pairs of socks put on in 30 seconds?
- *How many individual socks did you use altogether? Can you count them in twos?

Make up your own records!

- *Have a discussion with your family and create your own record-breaking challenges!
- *Challenge family members who do not live with you via phone, tablet or laptop!
